She recently released her debut indie pop EP, "Di Froyen," which sets to music the first three poems in Yiddish poet Kadya Molodowsky's cycle of the same name, a creative endeavor Katje began as her "Beyond Bronfman" project.

Edward-Isaac Dovere '97 (MC) is a senior reporter for CNN, covering Democratic politics and campaigns across the country. Prior to joining CNN, Isaac was the founding editor for two New York-centric magazines, *City Hall* and *The Capitol*, the chief Washington correspondent for *Politico* and a staff writer for *The Atlantic*. He is also the author of the bestselling book about Democrats in the Trump years and the 2020 election, *Battle for the Soul*.

Jonathan Safran Foer '94 is the author of the novels Everything Is Illuminated, Extremely Loud and Incredibly Close, and Here I Am; and of the nonfiction books Eating Animals and We Are the Weather. His work has received numerous awards and has been translated into thirty-six languages. Jonathan serves on the board of Farm Forward and is a passionate advocate for climate change solutions and more conscientious individual choices toward sustainability.

Hilary Caplan Somorjai ('19 parent), Gala Co-Chair, is Director of West Coast Admissions at Harvard Business School, and is a Bronfman Fellowship Board Member. She currently serves on the Silicon Valley Advisory Council for Common Sense Media and has been active in teen initiatives for the San Francisco Jewish Federation. **Donya Khalili Timofeyev** '97, Gala Co-Chair, is a mother of two and is the founder and CEO of Give Write Do, which equips parents to raise civically empowered children. Previously, she was Vice President and COO of Indivisible and served on the policy team of Cory Booker for Senate, where she worked on a range of domestic issues. She is married to Igor Timofeyev '91.

Becky Voorwinde '97 is CEO of The Bronfman Fellowship and, since 2008, has overseen the strategic planning for all aspects of the Fellowship in Israel and the US. Her professional experience includes work in Corporate Responsibility at EY and Diversity @ Work in Melbourne, Australia. Becky serves on the board of M²: The Institute for Experiential Jewish Education and Tivnu, a Jewish domestic gap year program.

A note about the cave and the tree in our event space: Aliza Gans '09, Communications Manager at Russ & Daughters, created these evocative interactive pieces inspired by a staple Bronfman text, the story of two Talmudic sages who hid in a cave to escape Roman persecution. God fed them with a carob tree while they studied and penned mystical texts, but they later struggled to reintegrate into the outside world. Torah offers a path forward, a dialogue between the physical and metaphysical, an imperative to take what we've learned beyond the cave and into the world.

Alina holds an MFA from Hunter College, works in education and film production, and publishes fiction and essays on art.

Shiri Kuban (Amitei Bronfman '10), Producer and Director: Israel, is a filmmaker and video editor based in Tel Aviv, currently editing TV shows for Israeli Public Television and working on a feature film.

Honoring Rabbi Sharon Cohen Anisfeld

Rabbi Sharon Cohen Anisfield, the first woman to serve as President of Hebrew College, is a Jewish pluralism trailblazer who has served as a teacher and role model to members of the Bronfman community over 15 different Fellowship years.

A Tribute to Rabbi Sharon from Hannah Kapnik Ashar '04

Director of Faculty, The Bronfman Fellowship

Sharon is a font of Torah in her teaching and also in her person.

As an educator, Sharon exudes love for our intellectual heritage. She reads text with focus and precision, and then brings her learners into the everexpanding palace of interpretation and insight. Sharon invites her learners to honor the tradition by participating in its unfolding. Her approach has grown to be deeply embedded in the pedagogy of Bronfman as a whole.

Sharon told me once that her favorite metaphor for being a rabbi is spiritual midwife. And indeed, Sharon – standing in her steady love and quiet but powerful uprightness – helps others hold visions of what is possible for how they might grow and bring things forth into the world, and how they might tolerate the "abyss" – the chaos and fruitful darkness – along the way.

Sharon is a core model for me as an educator, rabbi, and presence. I hope to have the *zechut* – the merit – for my own rabbinate to be in her legacy.

Hannah Kapnik Ashar will receive Rabbinic ordination from Mechon Hadar this June. She serves as the Director of Faculty at The Bronfman Fellowship and is the Founder of Rahmana, the women's prayer initiative. Hannah's relationship with Rabbi Sharon began in 2004 as a Fellow. They were faculty together in 2016.

Alumni Artwork: A Gift for Rabbi Sharon

We are thrilled to present Rabbi Sharon Cohen Anisfeld with these artworks by Joshua Meyer '91 and Hannah Bashkow '18. Hannah and Josh completed them in the style of "Exquisite Corpse," in which a work is begun by one person and then added to by a different artist. Their starting point was Rav Simcha Bunim's teaching of "two pockets," a common theme in the Bronfman experience: participants imagine that there are two slips of paper in their pockets, one with the words, "The world was created for me;" and on the other, "I am but dust and ashes."

The Artists in Their Own Words*

"In a very Bronfman fashion, the key question as I tried to paint on the image that Hannah began was whether and how to leave space for her while still asserting my own voice full-throatedly. Her palette is so different from mine, pure and vibrant, while I am inclined to hide



anything bright or loud. The marks we make and the texture we use are so very different. Many times I painted over an area she had painted and then scraped my own paint back to rediscover her imagery or repainted her colors and forms on top of my own. Art relies on the clarity of the artist's voice. Can you share space? Can you do it intellectually? Can you do it stylistically? A visual chevruta."– Joshua Meyer

"Being forced to paint over Joshua's work was the most interesting method of studying another artist's style I've ever tried! I definitely had fun trying to mimic Joshua's style to blend aspects of my layer with his, while also incorporating my own color palette and brushwork into his. It was also an exercise in compromise and ephemerality — we both agreed to give each other full license over our first painting after we switched and let our work disappear as the other's image appeared. Now, it's almost impossible to separate it back out into different authorship or ownership, forcing me to reflect on the fact that beyond all the dichotomies and juxtapositions of the two pockets, or life, or our vastly different artistic voices, everything in learning and in art is about interconnectivity." – Hannah Bashkow

About the Artists:

Joshua Meyer '91 is known for his thickly layered paintings of people, and for a searching, open-ended process. The Cambridge, Massachusetts artist studied art at Yale University and The Bezalel Academy, and has exhibited in galleries and museums internationally.

Hannah Bashkow '18 is a painter and multimedia artist living and working in Providence, RI. She is currently a senior studying Visual Art at Brown University, and is an appointed student leader within the Visual Art Department as well as an Honors candidate for her A.B. degree.
